- Welcoming Mike Charapata as the leader of Bloodworks Laboratories to grow operations and testing to support transfusion and transplantation needs.
- Opening a new Bloodworks Bio Apheresis Center to expand therapeutic patient care and research collections.
- Launching a new Bloodworks donor scheduling app to complement our new online scheduling portal, making booking an appointment even easier on mobile or desktop.
- Celebrating newly eligible donors and participating in our first PRIDE events since expanding donor eligibility through implementation of new FDA guidelines, which enable more people the opportunity to donate blood.
- Adding new Principal Investigators to our Research Institute to create opportunities for new scientific discoveries in blood-related research and patient therapies.

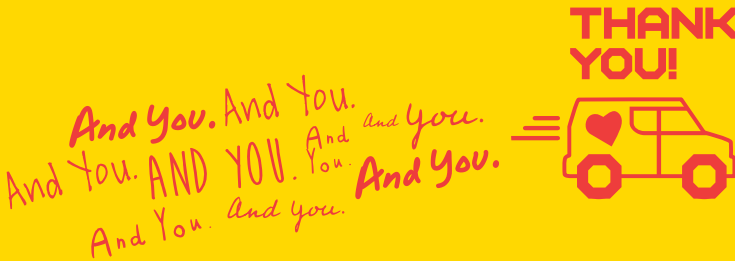

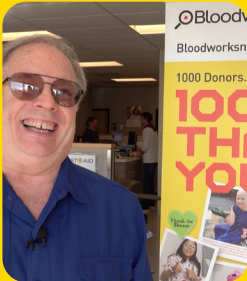

With capacity to collect nearly 12,000 donors annually, we're here to support the growing needs of local hospitals, including MultiCare Health System.

## CHOOSING HOPE: KRISTIN'S BLOOD CANCER STORY

A QUOTE BY CHRISTOPHER REEVE: "ONCE YOU CHOOSE  
HOPE, ANYTHING'S POSSIBLE."



IT'S THIS HOPE, ALONG WITH THE DECISION MADE BY TWO FAMILIES TO DONATE THEIR BABIES' CORD BLOOD AND THE  
GENEROSITY OF MORE THAN 90 BLOOD DONORS, THAT POWERS KRISTIN TODAY.

ALL is an aggressive form of blood cancer. Kristin's bone marrow was producing too many lymphocytes, a type of white  
blood cell, crowding out her healthy blood cells. Chemotherapy and Car-T therapy using Kristin's own stem cells cured  
her cancer; a cord blood transplant from a public cord blood bank ensured that it didn't come back. Kristin is a living  
reminder of why donation of all types – blood, cord blood, and financial support of medical research – is critical.

Chemotherapy doesn't distinguish between healthy and unhealthy cells. Kristin was constantly fatigued and struggled to  
even breathe. Red blood cell and platelet transfusions became a lifeline.

"I remember I could barely take a shower. I didn't even have energy to dry off. I would just have to go plop myself on the  
bed to catch oxygen, just to be able to dry off. And I was just so grateful when I would get that bag of red blood cells,  
because suddenly I felt like I could have a little bit more energy. I could breathe a little bit more."

Since 2000, Bloodworks Cord Blood Donation Program has banked over 14,000 cords for transplant and sent out 1200  
units to patients in need. In Fiscal Year 2024, we banked 346 units and distributed 17 units for transplant. Cord blood units  
that don't meet the criteria for transplant support the lifesaving medical research that leads to groundbreaking new cures.  
These generous gifts have allowed Kristin to become an aunt to more nieces and nephews, mom to more fur babies, and  
an advocate for patients and survivors.

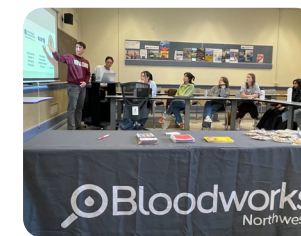

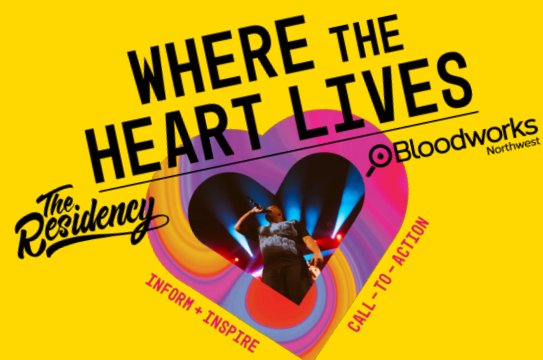

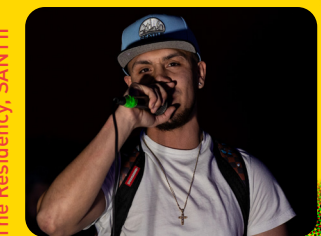

### NEW FACILITIES

Thanks to a generous grant from the Andy Hill CARE Fund, Bloodworks Bio opened the new Apheresis Center. This 10-bed collection space elevates our apheresis donor's safety, comfort, and experience, and positions Bloodworks as the largest apheresis center on the West Coast. This space will also serve as a comfortable location for individuals receiving therapeutic apheresis.

Also supported by the Andy Hill CARE Fund, Bloodworks Bio now operates an ISO-7 clean room, allowing end-to-end support for our clients, starting from collection and on to manufacturing of new cell and gene therapy products, all in one facility.

Red blood cells function to stopping bleeding in patients with low platelet counts

Published in *Blood*, the flagship journal of the American Society of Hematology, this finding from Dr. Jing-Fei Dong’s lab explains why anemic patients tend to bleed, and has significant implications on the standard-of-care for patients with hyperimmune response or undergoing chemotherapy.

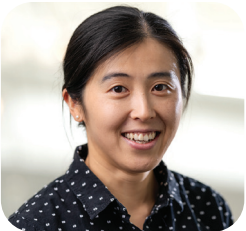

Discovery of a new population of platelets that appear upon aging and may contribute to blood clotting in elderly humans

Platelet dysregulation is drastically increased with advanced age and contributes to making cardiovascular disorders the leading cause of death in elderly humans. Published in the journal *Cell*, Dr. Raymond Adili’s lab discovered a secondary population of platelets that have hyperreactive behavior and unique molecular properties that could make them a novel therapeutic target to treat age-related thrombosis.

Platelet formation requires regulation of megakaryocyte rigidity

Platelets are one of the most produced cells in our body: we produce about 100 billion platelets every day! Dr. Amily Guo’s lab found that the cells that produce platelets, known as megakaryocytes, must become more flexible in order to form platelets. This finding will be critical not only for treating patients with low platelet counts, but also for the development of manufactured platelets.



OUR DISCOVERIES ARE REGULARLY PUBLISHED IN WELL-RESPECTED, PEER-REVIEWED SCIENTIFIC JOURNALS, CONTRIBUTING TO THE GLOBAL ADVANCEMENT OF PATIENT CARE. IN THE LAST YEAR, OUR RESEARCHERS HAVE PRESENTED THEIR FINDINGS WORLDWIDE.

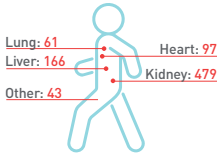

**DONOR TESTING**  
supports safe blood transfusion and organ transplant by testing for blood type and infectious diseases.  
*The FDA is considering testing of donated blood for malaria. The Donor Testing lab was involved with malaria testing trials at a national level.*

**TRANSFUSION SERVICES**  
supports safe blood transfusion by ensuring a correct match between donated blood and recipient.

**IMMUNOGENETICS (HLA)**  
supports safe organ transplants by ensuring a correct match between donor and recipient.

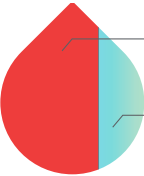

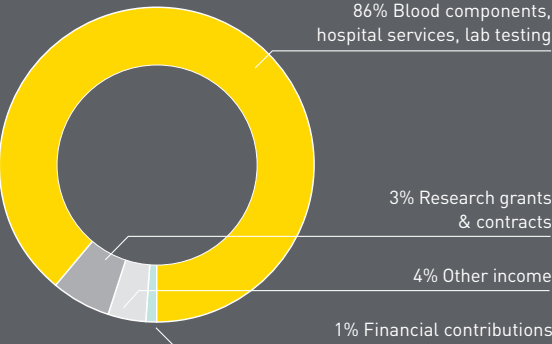

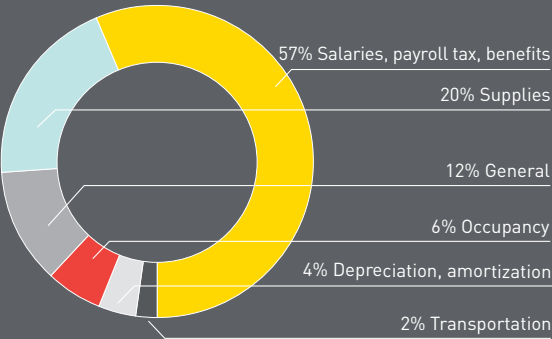
