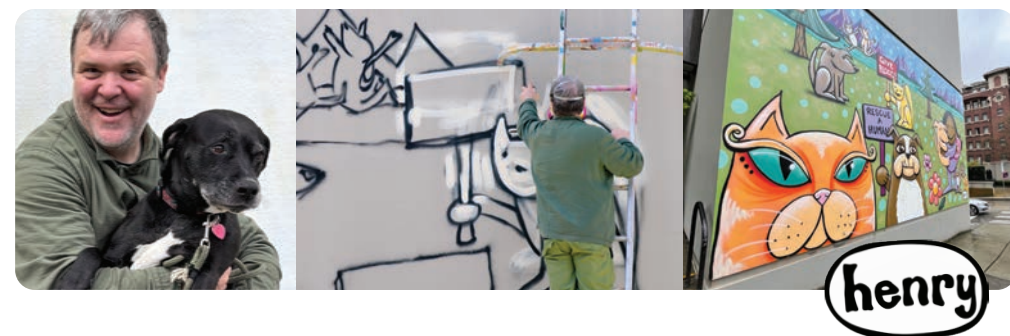

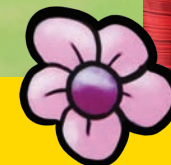

## LEAH PENNEY: BLOOD RECIPIENT PAWTNERS UP TO SAVE MORE LIVES

A furry friend is a rare delight at Bloodworks’ highly regulated facilities, and this is not just any old cat: it’s Zest, a permanent resident at Neko Cat Cafe and “just the most special sweet boy in the whole world,” according to Leah, Neko’s Assistant Meownager.

Zest and Leah visited Bloodworks during our **Give Blood. Rescue a Human.** campaign, celebrating the bond between people and their pets. “Donating blood is such an important way to support our community,” Leah said.

When she was six years old, Leah developed Pediatric Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorders Associated with Streptococcal Infections (PANDAS). Most kids recover from a common strep infection with little more than memories of a sore throat.

For PANDAS patients like Leah, antibodies from their own immune system attack healthy cells while fighting the invading bacteria. When this happens in brain tissue, it can lead to debilitating psychological and neurological issues.

Overnight, Leah went from a carefree, sociable child to one plagued by tics, anxiety, and OCD-like symptoms. She suffered from fears of contamination, germs, and food so intense that she needed to be hospitalized for weight loss and dehydration.

“None of the medications or therapies that typically work to treat anxiety or OCD in kids worked for me,” Leah said. “I had really no hope that I would ever get better or be able to live a normal life.”

Gobi, Leah’s childhood cat, became a source of comfort during this twelve-year ordeal. An infusion of IVIG (intravenous immune globulin), a treatment made from antibodies in donated plasma, gave Leah her life back.

**THE NEED FOR BLOOD IS GROWING. ACCESS TO BLOOD SHOULD TOO.** 32% of lapsed donors said they would be more likely to donate if blood drives were closer to their workplace, and convenience is the #1 factor in scheduling a blood donation in the next six months. As local patient need regularly outpaces donations, reaching blood donors matters more than ever. That's why we're launching *Mission In Motion*, a campaign to expand our fleet of bloodmobiles—to meet donors where they live, work, and play; to bring donation opportunities to rural, tribal, and under-served neighborhoods across our region; and to make sure blood is there whenever patients need it most.

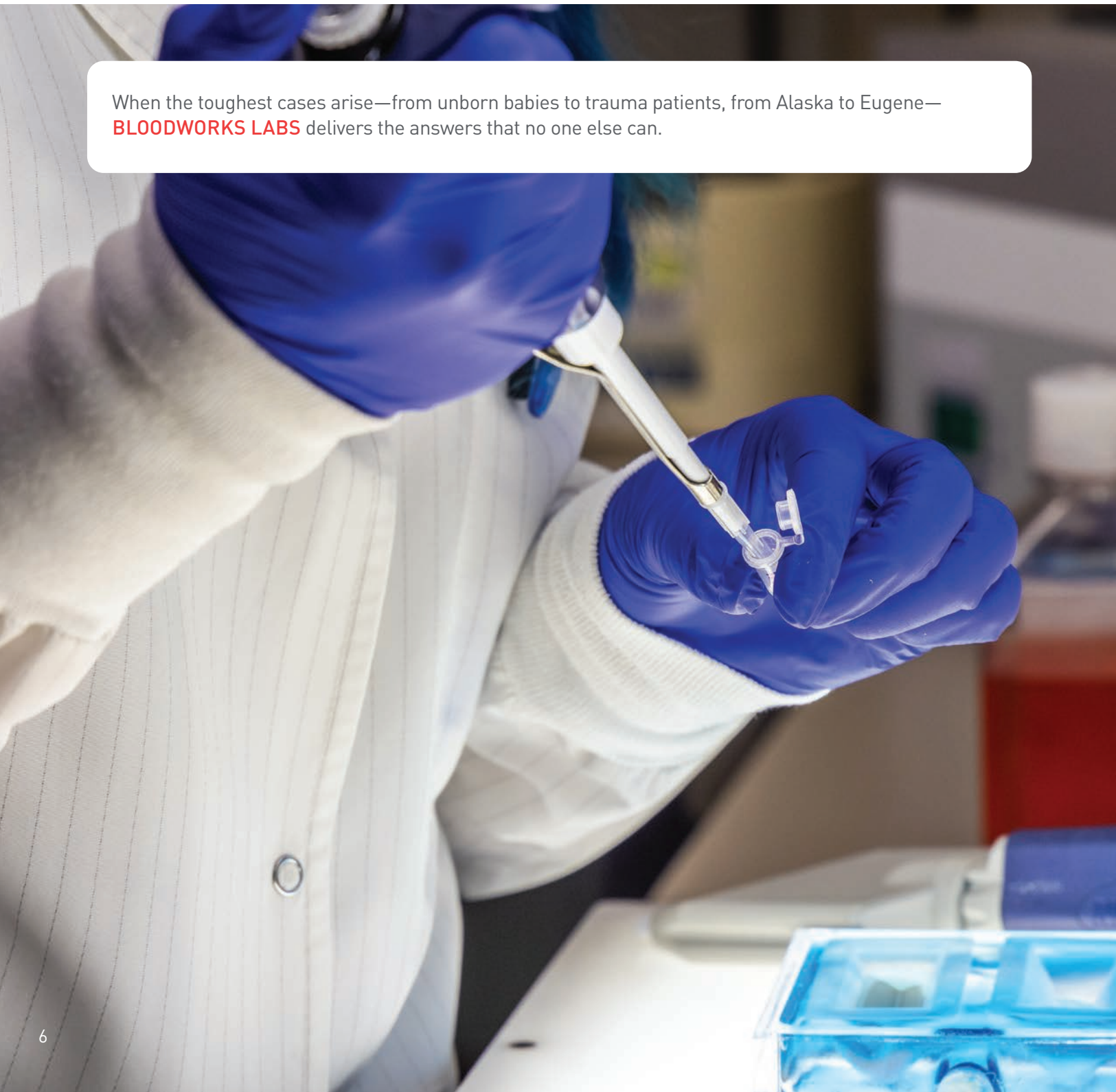

**AN UNBORN CHILD'S LIFESAVING DIAGNOSIS:**

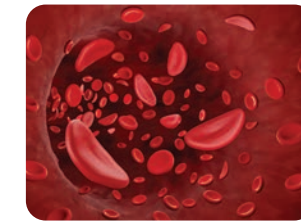
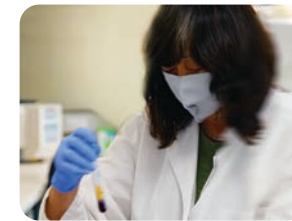

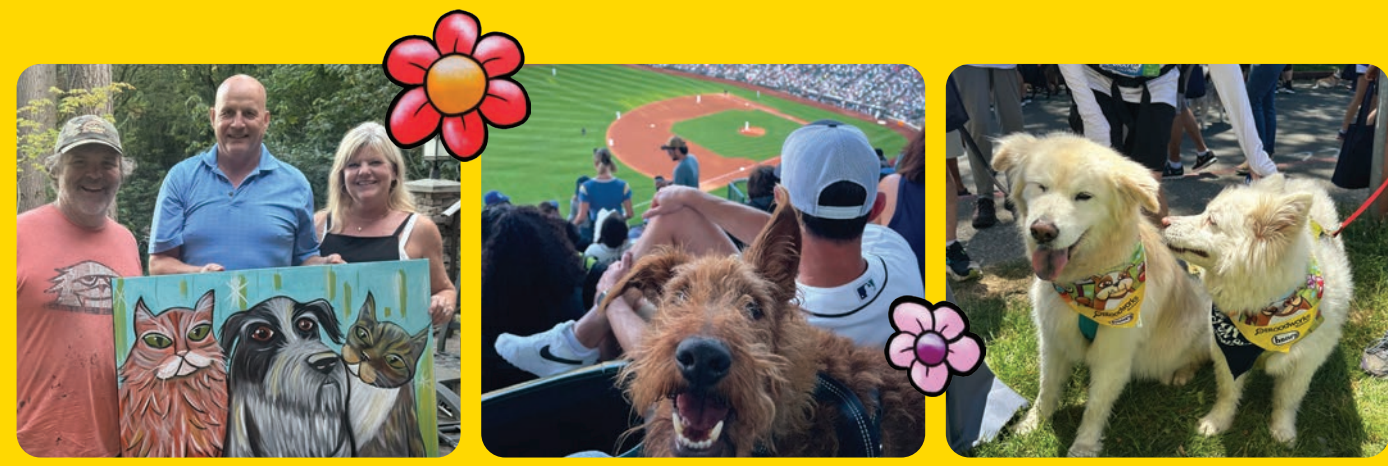

## MEET THE NEXT GENERATION OF LIFESAVERS!

Until 2020, more than 25% of the donations Bloodworks collected each year came from high school blood drives. We returned to schools in fall 2022, and today—with programs like *Where the Heart Lives*, *Red Honor Cord*, and *Vein to Vein*—Bloodworks aims to rebuild high school drives stronger than before.

Every high school blood drive is a true community effort: weeks of planning, classroom visits, and rallying students to step up and make a difference. Our team is there every step of the way, making sure new donors feel informed, at ease, and celebrated. Along the way, we see student leaders shine and school spirit soar, all in the name of saving lives. That’s our mission, brought to life.

## GRADUATING WITH HONORS

### Students Shine with Red Cords for Lifesaving Blood Donations

Graduates wearing Red Honor Cords stand out for more than just academic achievement. These cords, awarded through Bloodworks’ *Red Honor Cord Program*, recognize students ages 16–22 who donate blood at least four times during high school or college. 108 students received cords in the 2024–2025 school year.

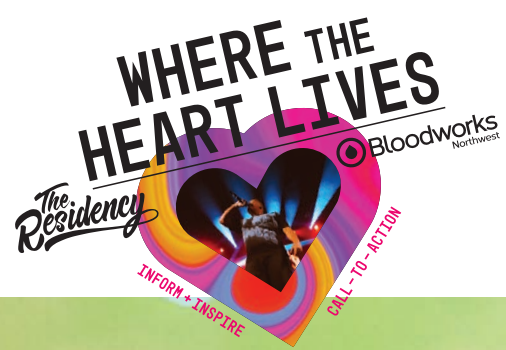
Each donation is a chance to save lives—and to inspire others. “As our high school’s blood drive president, I saw firsthand the impact the Red Honor Cord Program had on kids donating,” says Nevaeh Olinger, Kalama High School Class of ’25. “Every year a flood of seniors donated to get their red cord; not only does it honor the kids that have been donating since they have been 16, it also brings more donors in.”



Did you know that many people donate blood for the first time at a high school blood drive? We work with over 100 schools in Western Washington and Oregon to help students host drives and improve their leadership, project management, and lifesaving skills in the process.



Getting started is simple. Students are automatically enrolled after their first donation and can track their progress online or through the Bloodworks App. Every donation brings them closer to earning the red cord, a symbol of generosity and leadership.

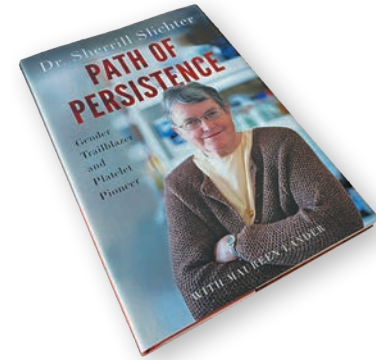

## DR. SHERRILL SLICHTER: CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF A BLOOD PIONEER



In 2017, Dr. Slichter published her autobiography, *Path of Persistence: Gender Trailblazer and Platelet Pioneer*, chronicling her journey as a woman in medicine and her relentless pursuit of scientific excellence.

THE HEMATOLOGY WORLD LOST A FORCE WITH THE PASSING OF DR. SHERRILL SLICHTER on August 13, 2025 at age 88. Dr. Slichter's 45-year career at Bloodworks Northwest left a lasting mark on the blood banking community—one that continues to impact the lives of patients, donors, and scientists alike. Her platelet transfusion research revolutionized the world of cancer treatment by making bone marrow transplantation possible and forever changing how blood banks manage platelets.

Dr. Slichter came to Bloodworks (then Puget Sound Blood Center) in 1970, seeking answers to the toughest challenges in modern transfusion medicine. She discovered that blood platelets circulate longer when stored at room temperature, rather than in the cold. She also found that they perform better when they are kept moving—the special incubator she developed in her research is still used by blood centers today across the world. These breakthroughs didn't just shape laboratory protocols: they helped improve the prognosis for cancer patients and made bone marrow transplantation possible.

Dr. Slichter's influence wasn't limited to science and medicine. Her curiosity, determination, and practicality left a mark on everyone she worked with. A colleague noted, "The platelet storage machine is sort of like her: she doesn't like to sit still." She was a dedicated mentor, collaborator, and philanthropist, frequently championing Bloodworks' mission through financial contributions. Her guidance and generosity reflected her deep commitment to the cause she championed throughout her life.

Dr. Slichter's legacy is built into every procedure, every trial, and every lifesaving transfusion at Bloodworks. She is survived by her extended family, colleagues, and innumerable patients touched by her lifesaving work. Please join us in celebrating her vision, mentorship, and unyielding pursuit of scientific excellence.

**NEW LINKS BETWEEN BLOOD CLOTTING AND VIRAL INFECTION**  
**Dr. Moua Yang's team** discovered a group of natural compounds that can block both blood clot formation and COVID-19 infection. This finding opens new paths for antithrombotic and antiviral drug development.



**STOPPING CANCER IN ITS TRACKS**  
**Dr. Jing-Fei Dong** revealed how damage to blood vessels can help gastric cancer spread—and how specific proteins may counter those effects. His research points toward new ways to prevent cancer from taking hold elsewhere in the body.



**GUIDING SAFER TRANSFUSIONS WORLDWIDE**  
**Dr. Moritz Stolla** co-authored new international guidelines for platelet transfusions, giving physicians evidence-based standards to make care safer and more consistent for patients everywhere.

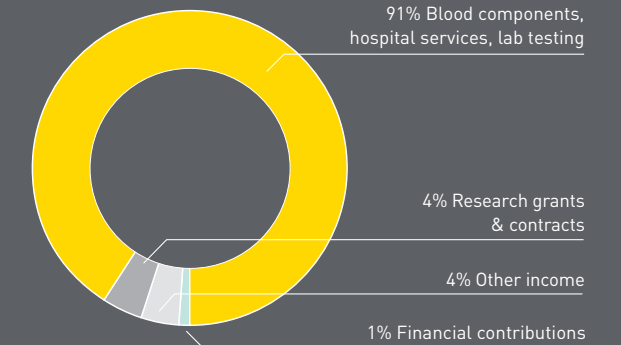

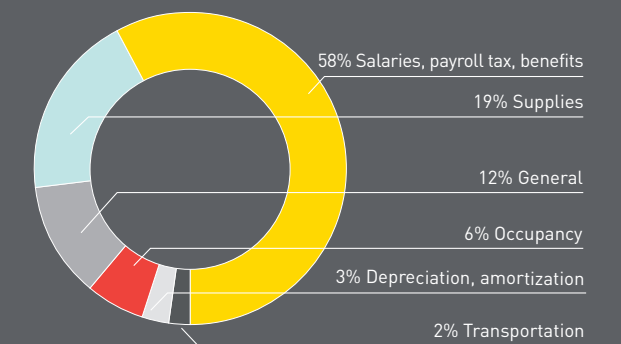
